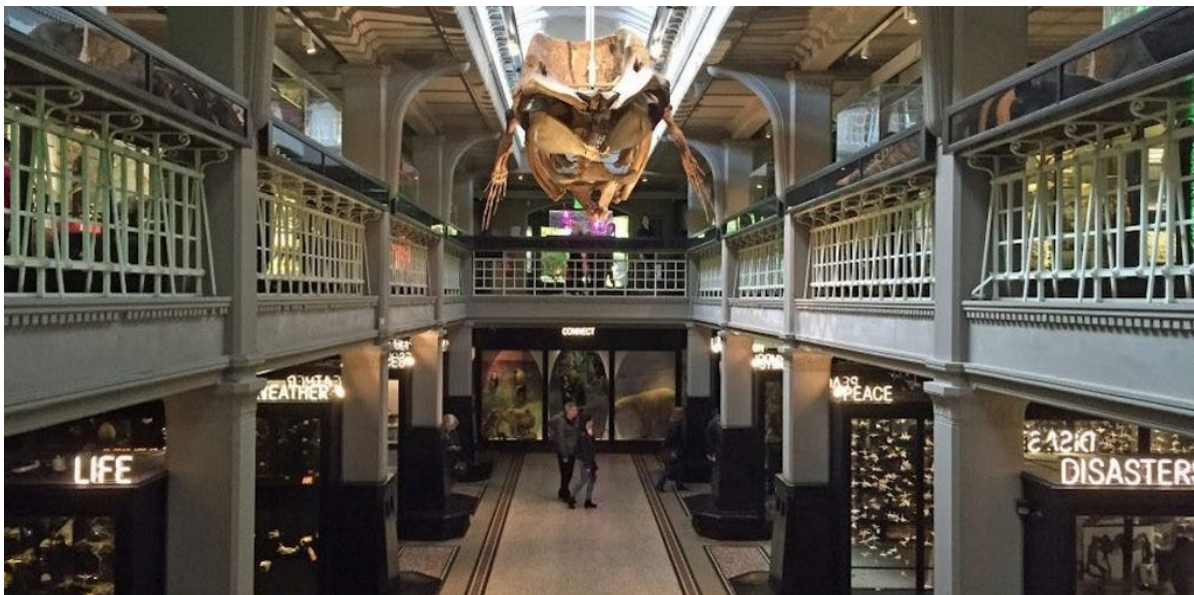


City Build was appointed to carry out an upgrade to the Museum's heating system plus refurbishment works within the listed neo-Gothic building. This sensitive project was undertaken in two phases, with the Museum remaining operational throughout.

Phase one was undertaken to the first floor of the Mammal Gallery and comprised the stripping out of the existing services installations, the installation of convector heaters and

associated pipework, new electrical installations, communication and data installations.

The heating and electrical improvements were undertaken within the fabric of the existing walls wherever possible to reduce the visual effect of the improvements.



To enable these works large areas of the existing timber paneling and building fabric had to be removed and replaced. In areas new paneling had to be introduced to conceal the new installations it was critical the new panels were constructed sensitively to match the existing walls.

Phase Two repeated these works to the Basement, Gallery, Animal Section, Human Body and Public Gallery floors.

All works were carried out within budget on programme and to the satisfaction of the university.
