The Peel Building is the oldest structure at the University of Salford's main campus and houses the Environment and Life Science Departments. The Accrington Brick and Terracotta detailed building was constructed at the end of the 19th Century and is Grade II listed.

City Build has undertaken numerous refurbishment projects to restore the Peel Building both internally and externally. Such projects included refurbishment works to the Core Toilet and Teaching Areas



within the building with the aim of bringing these facilities up to the latest modern standards and in line with other University facilities.

We have refurbished numerous rooms within the building and as part of these works. We have had to undertake restoration works to the timber sliding sash windows in these rooms also. These restoration works included taking out the existing windows, re-roping, installing new weights before re-fixing the window units and decorating the same. We have also supplied and constructed a new perimeter fire escape to the building which was installed sensitively to ensure it blended into its surroundings and without affecting the listed structure.

The University was in use throughout the building works, which necessitated carrying out detailed planning and programming exercises to ensure the works were carried out safely and with minimal disruption to all faculty users.
